

### <u>English</u>

- Recounts
- Narratives

#### English Basic Skills

- Conjunctions—when, so, if, or, because, that
- Commas in a list
- Suffix words
- Contracted Words

#### <u>Maths</u>

#### Fractions (3 Weeks)

- Recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a shape and set of objects.
- Write simple fractions for example, 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2.
- Connect unit fractions to equal sharing and grouping, to numbers when they can be calculated

#### Measurement—Length, Height and Temperature (2 Weeks)

- Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/ height in any direction (m/cm); temperature (°C) to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers and thermometers.
- Compare and order lengths and record the results using >, < and =.

#### Geometry—Position and Direction (1 Week)

• Order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences

• Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anti-clockwise).

#### <u>Digital Literacy</u>

During this unit, pupils will explore a range of Microsoft software, focusing upon their uses and functions. They will begin to understand how each programme has a particular purpose and will be able to explain its suitability, depending upon the intended outcome.

History

#### The Great Fire of Gateshead

During this history unit, the children will learn about a significant event in our local area of the North East and the events that followed and how the Great Fire changed Gateshead and Newcastle. From learning about the fire, pupils will look at the impact that this had on peoples' lives and the support from local people and businesses that helped clear up the disaster.

#### <u>Gustav Klimt</u>

In this unit of work, children will learn about the Austrian painter Gustav Klimt. They will discover how he become known for the highly decorative style of his works and will be introduced to a range of his most famous pieces including The Tree of Life, The Kiss and his Portrait of Adele Bloch-Bauer.
