Year Six Derwent Hill Residential: Last weekend, our year six pupils had a wonderful time at the Lake District for their end of year residential. The pupils enjoyed completing a range of activities: gorge walking, canoeing, high ropes challenge as well as the big swing. It was lovely to see them encouraging one another as they completed the activities in addition to overcoming fears — the big swing is quite high! I hope you managed to follow their weekend on Facebook; the photographs look fantastic and really capture the excellent time that was had by all. Nature Week: What a brilliant week we have had!

Nature week began with a visit from Heather, from a company called Wild Intrigue. The Year 5 children really enjoyed working with her to investigate the wildlife in our school grounds. That afternoon, Year 3 had a visit from the charity - Pawz for thought. The children were very excited to meet a baby gull, a baby kittiwake and a hedgehog. I know the children picked up lots of valuable tips to help protect these creatures.

On Tuesday, Year 4 worked with John from Durham Wildlife Trust to complete a wildlife tag trail which was great fun! They were also busy recording the species that live around our fields. The final visitors to our school, on Thursday, were Kate (from the Hancock Museum) and Fiona and Paul (from the Environmental Records Information office). They brought in sweep nets and other bug collecting equipment to work with groups of children to survey the forest area. KS2 children also benefited from three assemblies about how to enjoy and care for wildlife in our area. A huge thank you to all the organisations that have made our week such a success!

Throughout the week, children across the school have also been checking for evidence of hedgehogs in the school grounds! Using a hedgehog tunnel left in the grounds overnight, children from Years One to Three were delighted to find hedgehog footprints, the next morning, as evidence of our night-time visitors! Year Four will check their results on Monday morning. We can't wait to see what has happened over the weekend.

To support the creatures in our area, Year Two made bottle bird feeders and Year Four made fruit kebabs for the birds. Year Six, have produced some detailed maps to show how we can improve biodiversity on our site.

Throughout the week, children across the school have produced fantastic report writing, artwork and design technology projects. There are so many to mention, but I know that Year One really enjoyed their making smoothies and Nursery children created dens as part of their wild challenge.


JFK Superstars: Lessons: This week, we once again have lots of superstars to share with you...
