Year 3 Rebound Festival: On Thursday morning, year 3 were lucky enough to attend a trampolining festival where they hopped, bounced and jumped all morning, using a range of sports equipment at AAA Sports in Sunderland. Everyone had the chance to use the spring floor, air track, table vaults, box vaults, trampettes and the large trampolines. Football: This week saw the school football team compete in the first round of the Columbia Cup at Holley Park Academy. The first game was against Barmston. During the first half, a corner from Jack C met the head of a defender resulting in an own goal, giving the team the lead going into half time. Finley M had the best of the chances in the first half to double the lead, however, was denied by the goalkeeper. The team started the second half just as strong, showing excellent passing to carve out opportunities from the get-go. In the final minutes of the game, Finley M was able to secure the 3-0 win with a close-range effort.

The second game of the night was against the hosts, Holley Park. This was a must win game, with the winner of this game progressing through to the next round. Just before half time, Matthew M made an amazing last-ditch block to prevent Holley Park from taking the lead. As the game went on, the team grew in confidence and started to dominate. Building from the back, the team passed the ball through the lines before Harry G casually tucked the ball away into the bottom corner. The team defended the lead well and even had another chance, with the ball just going inches wide of the far post. The only goal of the game proved to be enough with the team progressing through to the final of the Columbia Cup, which will take place on Thursday 18th May.
