It was an incredibly busy week for football, with three different competitions taking place for two different teams.

The week started with the school football team taking part in the Alan Grimes County Cup against some of the top teams from across Durham and Sunderland. As a result, the level of competition was high and the team needed to play their best if they wanted to move forward towards the semi-finals. Our first game was against St Godric's from Durham. It started incredibly well, with the team flying into a strong 2-0 lead with goals from Billy B and Finley W. Our second game was against Howeletch Lane from Peterlee. It was a terrific team performance that saw the team win comfortably by 3 goals to nil. Billy B scoring 2 including a terrific flick over his shoulder and Finley W grabbing the third. The team went in to their final game against St. Benet's knowing a win would secure qualification for the next round. A positive start saw the team build up an early lead and through teamwork and desire they continued to push hard winning their final game 3-0 again. The goals this time scored by Billy B again with one and Jack C with the other two. After such a fantastic night of football, the school team has qualified for the semi-finals which will be held on Wednesday the 19th April.

Tuesday saw another competition and a brand-new team play. A newly selected year 4 team participated in their own County Cup at Rickleton against four other teams from Washington. This meant going into the final game, the team needed to win to have any chance of qualifying for the next round. A fantastic all-round performance saw a comfortable 3-0 win with goals from Lucas (2) and Aaron B. This result proved vital, as who qualified was so tight. Both JFK and Biddick had the same amount of goals scored, goals conceded and goal difference so it was eventually decided by the result between both teams with JFK narrowly scraping through thanks to their wonderful 1-0 win over Biddick.

Finally, the league continued on Thursday with games against Barmston, Rickleton and St. Bede's. The first game of the night saw a comfortable 2-0 victory with Billy B scoring both of the goals. Our second game looked destined to be decided by the weather, with a gust of wind moving the ball viciously in the air and away from the keeper giving Rickleton the lead.
