It has been lovely to see everyone back at school after the Easter holidays, refreshed and eager to learn.

Year 2 Haemophilia Day: On Wednesday, Year 2 celebrated Haemophilia Awareness Day. Throughout the day, they learned about what this very rare blood disorder is and completed a range of activities to raise awareness and celebrate. The children enjoyed learning about Haemophilia and were very lucky to receive a special (and tasty!) Haemophilia Awareness biscuit as an extra special treat. Reception: On Thursday, our reception pupils had their first balance bike training on the school yard. They were able to ride the bikes safely, with both feet off the floor across a set distance. Over the next few weeks, they will continue to build on these skills and their confidence.

JFK Superstars: A huge well done to Theo (year 6) who has successfully completed his "Junior Leadership" training at Taekwondo recently – and has been recruited as Junior Leader and will work alongside Taekwondo instructors to support other children to develop their martial arts skills. I know Theo's parents are immensely proud of him for this achievement as he has worked so hard through a selection process, practising Taekwondo patterns, and techniques – which also resulted in him progressing to a green belt. I look forward to hearing about Theo's Leadership role more as the year goes on!



We are very proud of James, who last night attended his first ever Ninja Training Session. He listened, joined in and waited for his turn. He loved it so much he kept shouting 'I am really good at this!' We are looking forward to hearing how it goes. Well done James.

Attendance: Thank you for the feedback we received regarding celebrating attendance in school before Easter, whether this was positive or constructive. We are prioritising attendance this term, as the Department for Education do expect all children to achieve 96% attendance. As a school, we realise that this may not be possible for a wide number of reasons, however, we will continue to acknowledge pupils who achieve this figure or are improving their attendance.

This week, our overall attendance is 94.28% and the classes with the best attendance are 2MA with 99.26%, followed closely by RSC/MO with 99.13%.

Flamenco Dance Workshop: On Tuesday 23rd April, as part of our celebrations for Spanish Language Day, the children will take part in a flamenco dance workshop ran by a qualified dance instructor. To support this activity, we are asking for a £1 voluntary donation per child via ParentPay. Gracias! Pupils are also being encouraged to wear red or yellow for the day.

PE Lessons: Children can wear their PE kit to school on the day. This should be a plain white t-shirt, black jogging bottoms/leggings and trainers. At this time of year we aim to have PE outside on the yard or field if the weather is suitable, however we do still ask that children have a jumper or jacket with them as there is still a chill in the air.

Football News

On Thursday evening, the year four football team took part in the first round of the Year 4 Trophy at Rickleton. Their first game of the competition saw them take on Marlborough. This was a dominant performance from start to finish for the JFK team, with Marlborough struggling to get out of their own half throughout. Dain L had the best chance of the first half, his effort going inches past the post. At the start of the second half, Jude C was able to rifle home the opener from outside of the box. Jude C was able to quickly double his tally minutes later, seeing his free kick sail into the top corner. In the final moments of the game, a shot ricocheted off a Marlborough defender resulting in an own goal and securing the 3-0 victory.

The second game of the evening saw the team take on Our Lady Queen of Peace. This was another fantastic performance where JFK outworked the opposition in every area of the pitch. Jude C certainly had his shooting boots on today, opening the scoring with a lovely effort slotted past the keeper. Jacob L covered every blade of grass on the pitch throughout the game and he earned his reward, bursting into the box before his left footed strike found the bottom corner of the goal. JFK continued the high intensity throughout the second half and continued to make chance after chance. Our Lady were unable to clear the ball from a corner resulting in the ball bouncing in the box, Freddie B was able to get his toe on the end of the ball to poke it into the bottom corner. JFK winning the game 3-0.

Our final game of the night was against the hosts, Rickleton. JFK started as they had left off, Jude C opened the scoring within the first two minutes drilling a fabulous left footed strike past the opposition keeper. Just after the half time break, Rickleton were able to find an equaliser. JFK did not put their heads down and rallied after the goal, taking complete control of the game. Olivia B and Jacob L did well in the build-up before finding Jude C who was able to twist and turn before his strike on goal put JFK 2-1 up. Brilliant defending in the final minutes from the entire team saw out the result, JFK finishing with three wins from three games.

The fantastic showing from the team secured qualification for the final of the Year 4 Trophy in May. Well done to everyone who played!
