**Bike Safety:** Linking into Bikeability, if your child rides their bike to school unaccompanied, could we ask parents to remind their child to cycle safely to school using appropriate paths etc. We have received feedback from some parents who have noticed pupils cycling down the middle of the surrounding roads to school which can be very dangerous, especially during peak school times. Also, we actively encourage all pupils to wear safety helmets if riding to school on bikes or scooters.

## Football - w/c 11th March

**Girl's Football** - On Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March, the girls' team continued their league campaign with their eyes set on breaking into the top two. The first game of the day was against Holley Park. JFK dominated for majority of the game creating chance after chance, being denied by some good goalkeeping. Amelia T was able to open the scoring with a shot from outside of the box that found the bottom corner. The opposition showed great determination after conceding and in the final minutes of the game, they were able to equalise. The game finishing 1-1.

The second game saw the team take on Springwell. This was a dominating performance from the very first whistle. Midway through the first half, Ella-Mae R was able to put the defender under enough pressure to turn over the ball in their own box before rifling home the opener. A quick-fire double from Holly R and Amelia at the beginning of the second half quickly saw JFK take a 3-0 lead. Ella W went close and nearly made it four, her shot on goal hitting the post. Darcy G was constantly talking and organising the defenders well throughout. Good defending and reading of any potential danger from Lucy H and Mia R prevented any chances going Springwell's way, securing the win.

The third game of the night was against Rickleton. The team were full of confidence from the Springwell game and this showed from kick off. Within two minutes, a quick throw in from Holly R found Amelia T, who was able to turn and hammer the ball into the top corner. Ella Mae R was everywhere on the pitch and was causing a lot of problems for Rickleton, who were constantly under pressure when they had the ball. Late into the second half, Amelia T picked up the ball at the half way line and drove past three defenders before rocketing the ball into the top corner from outside of the box. With the game finishing 2-0, JFK ended the night with their unbeaten league campaign intact and moved up into second place. Well done to everyone who played.

School Football Team - On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March, the school football team carried on their league campaign at Lambton. The first game of the day was against Springwell. This was a dominant performance from the team, with Springwell only producing one shot at goal in the entire game. Reuben H and Lennox b were brilliant at spotting and preventing any potential danger throughout the game. Lucas S led the line as striker and was brilliant at causing problems for the defenders, at one point even having three of them marking him everywhere he went. Sam M played a lovely cross into the box, finding Lucas S but his volley just went wide of the post. JFK continued to carve out chance after chance throughout, seeing efforts go just wide or being denied by the goalkeeper. The determination paid off as in the final minute of the game, Alfie A was able to drive with the ball and find Sam M in the box, who was able to make space for himself before slotting the ball past the keeper. The last-minute winner securing the victory for JFK.

The second game of the night was against league leaders, Lambton. This was a very tight contest and a good display of the standard of football in the Washington area. Both teams had chances early in the first half, Cole F was able to produce a magnificent save to deny Lambton of an opener. Lucas S once again was causing issues for the defenders and saw his long-range effort tipped over the bar by the Lambton goalkeeper. The opposition were able to break the deadlock just before half time, a lucky bounce of the ball on the muddy playing surface fell to their striker who was able to poke it into the corner of the goal. Despite conceding on the brink of half time, the team showed tremendous team spirit and went out in search of the equaliser. Early into the second half, JFK were denied a goal by a heroic save by Lambton's goalkeeper. As the team were pushing for a goal, Lambton were able to win the ball back and counter leading to a penalty, which put them 2-0 up. Even though they were unable to bring the score back, the team showed fantastic attitudes throughout and can hold their heads high.

## Football – w/c 18th March

**Year 4 Football:** On Monday night, the year 4 football team took part in the County competition at Rickleton. Their first game was against Biddick Primary. This was a fast-paced game with lots of action throughout the first half. Biddick were able to quickly take the lead before adding two more with minutes to go before half time. A long throw in to the box found Calvin S who was able to fire it past the keeper, the score being 3-1 going into half time. During the second half, Biddick were able to score another but were quickly pegged back through a goal by Jude C. In the final minute of the game, Biddick sealed the 5-2 victory.

The next game was an end-to-end thriller with 7 goals between the two teams as JFK took on Rickleton. Rickleton had the best of and took their chances in the first half, racing into half time with a 3-0 lead. Despite the score line, the year 4 team did not let it get to their heads. It was brilliant to see the determination and confidence from JFK build in the second half. A goal from Calvin S and two goals from Jude C, saw the score line level at 3-3 before Rickleton scored a winner in the dying moments.

They were able to open the scoring before half time and quickly added two more in the second half, securing the 3-0 victory. Unfortunately, the team were unable to qualify for the next round in the year 4 county competition, however, they showcased brilliant attitudes throughout and we look forward to competing in the year 4 trophy after Easter.

**Girls County:** On Tuesday, the girls' football team competed in the County competition along with other teams in Washington. The first game of the day was against St Bedes. JFK started strongly, having a number of opportunities to open the scoring. The deadlock was broken by Holly R, who was able to score directly from a corner. Strong defending from the team was enough to weather the storm in the second half, Darcy G producing a top class save in the final minutes to secure the 1-0 win.

The second game of the night was against Biddick Primary. Ella-Mae R caused issues early on with her fantastic pressing of the opposition making defenders uncomfortable when they had the ball. Biddick were able to open the scoring, hitting JFK on the counter attack and seeing a strike from distance find the bottom corner. JFK had a number of chances to equalise the scoreline however were denied by strong defending and some solid saves by the Biddick keeper, the game ending 0-1.

The third game of the night saw JFK take on Rickleton. This was a game where the opposition were clinical at taking their chances. Rickleton were able to take the lead through excellent passing finding someone with space in the box, who was able to place it into the bottom corner. JFK girls were able to have some chances, but Rickleton added their second and third goals in the final minutes of the game to secure the 3-0 win.

The final game of the night was against George Washington. George Washington took the lead early on with a good finish from just inside the box. JFK rallied and did not let their heads drop, growing with confidence as the game went on. From a throw in, JFK were able to win the ball back off the opposition and find Amelia T, who burst past two defenders and cooly slotted the ball past the goalkeeper. The game ended 1-1. Unfortunately, with only one team going through to the next stage, JFK did not gain enough points to qualify finishing third in the group.

**Girls Trophy:** On Thursday evening, the girls' team competed in the first round of the Girls Trophy. The first game of the evening was against Holley Park. This was an end to end game with both teams creating chance after chance. Ella-Mae R was able to open the scoring, pouncing on an error by the defender to give JFK the lead. Lucy H had an effort on goal that went just wide of the post. Another solid defensive performance at the back from Mia R, Amelia T and Ella W secured the 1-0 victory.
