World Book Day: Just a reminder that the school will be celebrating the love of books by participating in World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. Pupils are encouraged to wear clothing to express an emotion – examples were sent before half-term.

Racism Awareness Workshops: On Tuesday 19th & 26th March, Sunderland Foundation of Light will be coming into school to work with children from Year 2 to Year 6 around the topic of racism. Children will take part in workshops across the day and learn about the dangers of assumptions and stereotypes. Along with this, they will learn the definition of racism and derogatory language so they can take this with them to spot and address racism or the use inappropriate language in the future. They will learn about 'world view' and the importance of critical thinking in their everyday lives.

The Sunderland coaching staff will also be holding sessions for parents on the above dates, after school. An email has been sent to the parents of the above year groups to offer these sessions by completing a form. Whilst parents are taking part in the workshops, children can take part in a football training session with the Sunderland coaches.
