It has been a very busy final week for the football.

On Thursday night, the year 5 team competed in the Year 5 Trophy at Biddick Academy. The first game of the night was against George Washington. Despite an early chance from the opposition, JFK grew into the game and showcased good passing play and communication. The best chance came late in the game with a corner from Sam M connecting with Charlie S before being cleared off the line. Although they created the better of the chances, the team were unable to break the deadlock resulting in a 0-0 draw. The second game of the night was against Biddick. Amelia T had the best chance in this game to open the scoring for JFK, finding herself at the edge of the box forcing a good save from the goalkeeper. Biddick were able to break forward in the dying minutes of the game to go 1-0 up, which ended up being the only goal of the game. The final game of the night was against Lambton. Once again, JFK showed good passing ability and were utilising the width of the pitch, however, the winning goal went to Lambton. Following the goal, Cole F made a number of good saves to keep it 1-0. Unfortunately, this result meant that JFK did not qualify from their group for the next round. Well done to everyone that played on Thursday showing brilliant determination throughout!

This week also saw the school football team conclude their final two games of the league campaign. On Monday, we were the hosts for the game against Our Lady. The school team started very strongly and were untouchable for the first minutes of the game with the visitors unable to win the ball due to impressive passing and moving. Billy B opened the scoring and was soon celebrating his second, giving the team a 2-0 lead. An impressive display all around saw the team close out the win and saw us take the top spot in the league with one game remaining.

Our final game of the league season was away to Usworth Colliery. The team were very excited for this one and eager to seal the title. During the opening minutes of the first half, Usworth were very much on top. Jay B was forced to make a number of excellent saves including a one v one, which he tipped off the post. As the first half was coming to a close, Finley W slotted the ball past the goalkeeper and into the far corner of the goal to give JFK the 1-0 lead into half time. The team were fuelled by this and started the second half with the same intensity that they had finished the first with. Within minutes of the restart, Billy B powered home an effort to double the lead. Usworth tried to break through, but every time were denied by the defending of Connor B, Layton H and Matthew M, who were very composed throughout the second half. A corner from Jack C found the head of Harry G, who drove his header into the net, giving JFK their third goal of the game. That was not the end, however, as in the final minutes of the game Jack C turned from provider to finisher, getting himself on to the scoresheet and wrapping up the 4-0 win.

As the final whistle blew, the team knew that they had done what they had set out to do. An unbeaten season, only a handful of goals conceded and a fantastic treble having already secured the Autumn Cup and Columbia Cup earlier in the season.
