Dear Parents and Carers,

Infantasia: On Monday, our year 2 pupils visited Rickleton Primary School to participate in Infantasia - an annual singing activity organised by Sunderland Music Hub.

They had a spot during the visit to entertain the other primary schools – our year 2 sung 'Don't Worry be Happy' and the 'Giggle' song. They were also great audience members, cheering on and joining in with familiar songs sung by other local schools.

Washington Mind: Our school council members visited Washington Mind on Tuesday. As it is National Nest Box Week, they worked well as a team to make some bird boxes. Tom, from Durham Wildlife Trust. The children are really looking forward to putting up the boxes in Forest School when we return after the holidays!

Parents Evening: Thank you to everyone who managed to attend the two evenings in school this week. I hope you found it useful and informative to look at your child's books and speak to the teacher about their progress. This links closely to our PSHE curriculum and our school focus on children's mental health and wellbeing. To help us celebrate, we would like to see children coming into school dressed as an emotion or feeling of their choice – examples of these were sent out via ParentPay and on Facebook, most of which involve little or no cost.

Each child is receiving their £1.00 book voucher today, so that they can either exchange for one of the free World Book Day titles, or to help towards to costs of another book.

WCFP: This half term, Washington Community Food Project are once again offering free packed lunches to all school aged children (accompanied by an adult). Families do not need to be in receipt of food parcels or any benefits to take advantage of this, and children can get a packed lunch every day between 20-23rd February should they wish.
